## 2. Research Stages

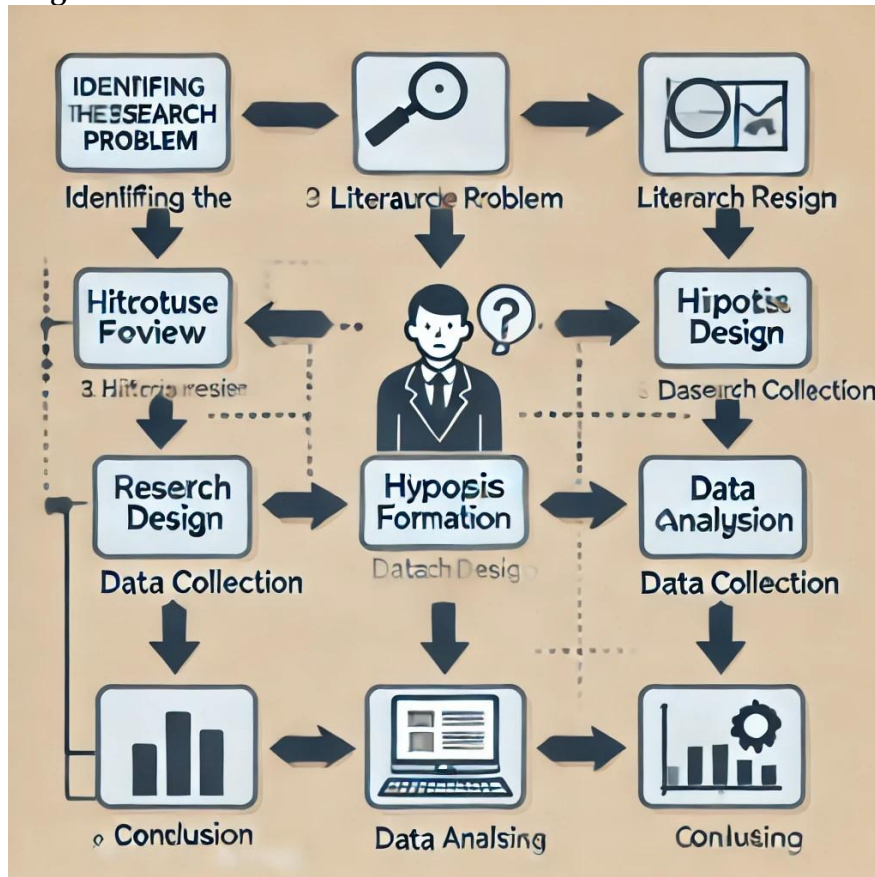


Figure 1 Research Stages
